Entrants are encouraged to read this guide carefully before beginning their nomination to ensure that submissions are complete, category-relevant, evidence-led and aligned with the Awards criteria.

- The H.H. Sheikh Mansoor Bin Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Emirati Rising Star Award is open exclusively to UAE Nationals.

Awards Recognition Pillars

The Intersec Global Awards are structured across three recognition pillars.

1. Technology & Product Excellence

Recognizing innovative products, platforms, technologies, systems and services that improve safety, security, fire protection, emergency response, cybersecurity and resilience outcomes.

This pillar celebrates solutions that address real industry challenges, demonstrate innovation and deliver measurable value for users, customers, organizations, authorities or communities.

2. Project & Implementation Excellence

Recognizing outstanding projects and deployments that demonstrate excellence in planning, implementation, integration, collaboration and measurable real-world impact.

This pillar celebrates projects that have moved from concept to execution and delivered clear operational, safety, security, resilience, compliance or performance outcomes.

3. People & Talent

Recognizing individuals and organizations that are advancing leadership, talent, professionalism, inclusion and workforce excellence across the safety, security and resilience sectors.

This pillar celebrates the people and employers shaping the future of the industry through leadership, talent development, innovation, culture and contribution.

Entry Guidelines

- All entries must be submitted through the official online awards portal.
- All nominations must be submitted in English.
- The Intersec Global Awards are free to enter.
- Entries must be submitted by the published deadline. Late submissions may not be accepted.
- Entrants may submit multiple entries across different categories, provided each entry is relevant to the selected category.
- The same product, solution or project may only be entered into one category. Where duplicate entries are identified, Intersec Global Awards reserves the right to assess only the entry deemed most relevant.
- Responses should be clear, concise, factual and written in bullet-point format where requested.
- Each question should be answered within the stated word limit. Where no word limit is specified, entrants should provide enough detail to support judging without including unnecessary promotional content.
- Entries should avoid excessive marketing, sales or brochure-style language. Judges will be looking for evidence, impact, innovation, relevance and measurable outcomes.
- Entrants should support claims with proof wherever possible. Supporting evidence may include data, metrics, case studies, customer testimonials, certifications, photographs, videos, operational results, media coverage, user feedback or other relevant documentation.
- A supporting video is required for all entries. The video should directly support the written submission and help judges understand the nominated product, solution, project, organisation or individual.
- For the Brand Excellence in Safety, Security & Resilience Award, shortlisted organizations may also use approved entry materials to promote their participation in the peer voting phase through their own communication channels.
- Product, solution and project entries are open globally and must relate to products, solutions, services, initiatives or projects launched, significantly upgraded, implemented, commissioned or substantially delivered between August 2024 and July 2026.
- People & Talent categories do not permit self-nominations. Individual nominees must be nominated by an employer, organization, colleague, manager, mentor, industry peer or authorized representative.
- The H.H. Sheikh Mansoor Bin Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Emirati Rising Star Award is open exclusively to UAE Nationals.
- All entries must be submitted by an authorized representative. Intersec Global Awards reserves the right to reject submissions made without appropriate authorization.
- Entrants must provide valid email addresses and operational mobile numbers for all nominated contacts.

- Incomplete submissions, entries containing insufficient information, entries submitted in the wrong category or entries failing to address the required criteria may be rejected or reassigned to a more suitable category.
- All information submitted must be accurate, verifiable and approved for submission. Intersec Global Awards reserves the right to request additional supporting information during the judging process.
- Entrants are responsible for ensuring that any submitted images, videos, testimonials, customer references, logos, trademarks or third-party materials have been approved for use.
- Entrants must not submit confidential, classified, restricted, commercially sensitive or security-sensitive information unless they have the right and authorization to do so.

Entry Process

Follow the process below to prepare, complete and submit a strong nomination through the official awards portal.

Step	Entry Stage	Guidance
1	Review of the Awards Infopack	Before starting a nomination, entrants should carefully review the Awards Infopack, including the award categories, purpose, eligibility requirements, judging criteria, video guidelines and terms and conditions.
2	Select the Most Relevant Category	Entrants should choose the category that best reflects the nominated product, solution, project, organization or individual. The same product, solution or project may only be submitted into one category. If an entry appears better suited to another category, Intersec Global Awards reserves the right to reallocate it.
3	Registering through the Online Awards Portal	Entrants must register on the official online awards portal and create login credentials. Once registered, entrants may begin a new submission, save progress and return later to complete or update the entry before the deadline.
4	Complete the Entry Details	Entrants must complete all required fields in the online form. For product, solution and project categories, the entry name should clearly state the name of the nominated product, solution or project. For People & Talent, the entry name should clearly state the name of the nominated individual or organization.
5	Prepare a Clear Written Submission	Entrants should answer all required questions clearly and factually. Submissions should focus on the category criteria, including innovation, relevance, implementation quality, measurable impact, leadership, professional contribution or organizational excellence, depending on the selected category. Entrants should avoid generic marketing statements and focus instead on specific achievements, evidence and outcomes.
6	Upload Supporting Evidence	Entrants should upload relevant supporting documents where available. Supporting evidence may include data and performance metrics, case studies, customer or user testimonials, certifications or standards, photographs, video links or files, project documentation, media coverage, operational results, letters of support and other relevant proof points.
7	Uploading the Supporting Video	A supporting video is required for all entries. For Product and Project entries, the video should be between 3 and 5 minutes in length and should directly support the nomination. For People & Talent entries, a simple testimonial-style video or recorded statement is acceptable. A professionally produced video is not required. The video must be in English or include clear English subtitles.
8	Review of the Submission	Before submitting, entrants should review the full nomination to ensure that all required questions have been answered, the correct category has been selected, the entry is factual and evidence-led, the video has been uploaded or linked correctly, supporting documents are included where relevant, contact details are accurate and all submitted materials are approved for use.
9	Submit Before the Deadline	Completed entries must be submitted through the online awards portal by the published deadline. Entries may be edited, saved and updated until the deadline. Once the deadline has passed, changes may not be accepted.
10	Judging Review	After the deadline, eligible entries will be reviewed by the Intersec Global Awards judging panel. The judging process will include eligibility screening, conflict-of-interest checks, independent scoring, moderation, shortlist selection and winner selection.
11	Shortlist Announcement	Shortlisted entrants will be announced on the published shortlist announcement date. Shortlisted entrants may be contacted by the Awards team for additional information, verification, marketing materials, images or approved summaries. For the Brand Excellence in Safety, Security & Resilience Award, shortlisted organizations may also be invited to participate in a peer voting phase through the official awards platform. The peer voting phase will allow shortlisted organizations to promote their entry to their professional networks, employees, clients, partners and wider industry community. All peer votes must be submitted through the official awards platform during the published voting period.
12	Awards Gala Dinner	Winners will be announced at the Intersec Global Awards Gala Dinner on 12 January 2027 . Please note that entry submission or shortlisting does not include attendance at the Gala Dinner. If you wish to attend the awards ceremony, a Gala Dinner ticket must be purchased separately.

1	Best National Security & Law Enforcement Solution	This award recognizes an outstanding solution that strengthens national security, law enforcement capability, public safety, border protection, operational readiness or crisis response. It celebrates technologies, systems, platforms and services that help authorities, agencies and institutions protect sovereignty, maintain public order, enhance situational awareness and respond more effectively to evolving security risks. Eligible solutions may include command, control and communications systems, border and identity solutions, digital policing platforms, public safety technologies, CBRNe detection, counter-terrorism support systems, incident management platforms, secure mobility solutions, training and simulation technologies, and other solutions that support civil security, law enforcement and national resilience.	- Open to manufacturers, technology providers, software developers, systems integrators, specialist consultants and solution providers delivering products, platforms or services for national security, law enforcement, public safety or resilience applications. - The nominated solution must have been commercially launched, significantly upgraded, deployed or implemented between August 2024 and July 2026. - Entrants must demonstrate clear innovation, operational relevance, measurable impact and suitability for use by government, public-sector, institutional, law enforcement, public safety or critical infrastructure stakeholders. - Entries must relate to civil security, law enforcement, public safety, national resilience, border security, crisis readiness or protective capability. 2	Best Cybersecurity & Resilience Solution	This award recognizes an outstanding cybersecurity or digital resilience solution that helps organizations protect digital assets, secure critical systems, reduce cyber risk and strengthen operational continuity. It celebrates technologies, platforms, services and frameworks that improve digital trust, cyber defense, detection, response, recovery, governance or resilience across connected environments. Eligible solutions may include network and cloud security, endpoint protection, identity and access management, data protection, threat intelligence, SOC and incident response platforms, OT and critical infrastructure cybersecurity, governance, risk and compliance solutions, managed security services, digital forensics, cyber resilience platforms and other solutions that strengthen cyber readiness.	- Open to cybersecurity vendors, managed security service providers, managed detection and response providers, technology integrators, software developers, consultancies and solution providers. - The nominated solution must have been commercially launched, significantly upgraded, deployed or implemented between August 2024 and July 2026. - Entrants must demonstrate measurable customer impact, innovation, technical credibility and relevance to cybersecurity, digital trust, critical infrastructure protection, enterprise resilience or operational continuity.
3	Best Surveillance & Physical Security Solution	This award recognizes an outstanding solution that enhances the protection of physical environments, buildings, assets, infrastructure, public spaces or operational sites. It celebrates technologies, systems and services that improve visibility, access control, detection, monitoring, response, site protection or integrated physical security performance. Eligible solutions may include surveillance systems, video management platforms, AI analytics, access control, identity and credentialing systems, intrusion detection, alarm systems, perimeter protection, smart building security, control room technologies,	- Open to manufacturers, technology providers, physical security vendors, systems integrators, installers, software developers, consultants and service providers operating within the surveillance and physical security sector. - The nominated solution must have been commercially launched, significantly upgraded, deployed or implemented between August 2024 and July 2026. - Entrants must demonstrate innovation, measurable impact, user relevance and the ability to improve safety, security, visibility, control or resilience across physical environments.

4	Best Fire Safety Solution	This award recognizes an outstanding fire safety solution that helps prevent fires, detect risks early, protect people and property, support evacuation, improve compliance or reduce the impact of fire incidents. It celebrates innovation in fire protection, life safety, detection, notification, suppression, passive protection, evacuation, monitoring, inspection or risk management. Judging Panel
